



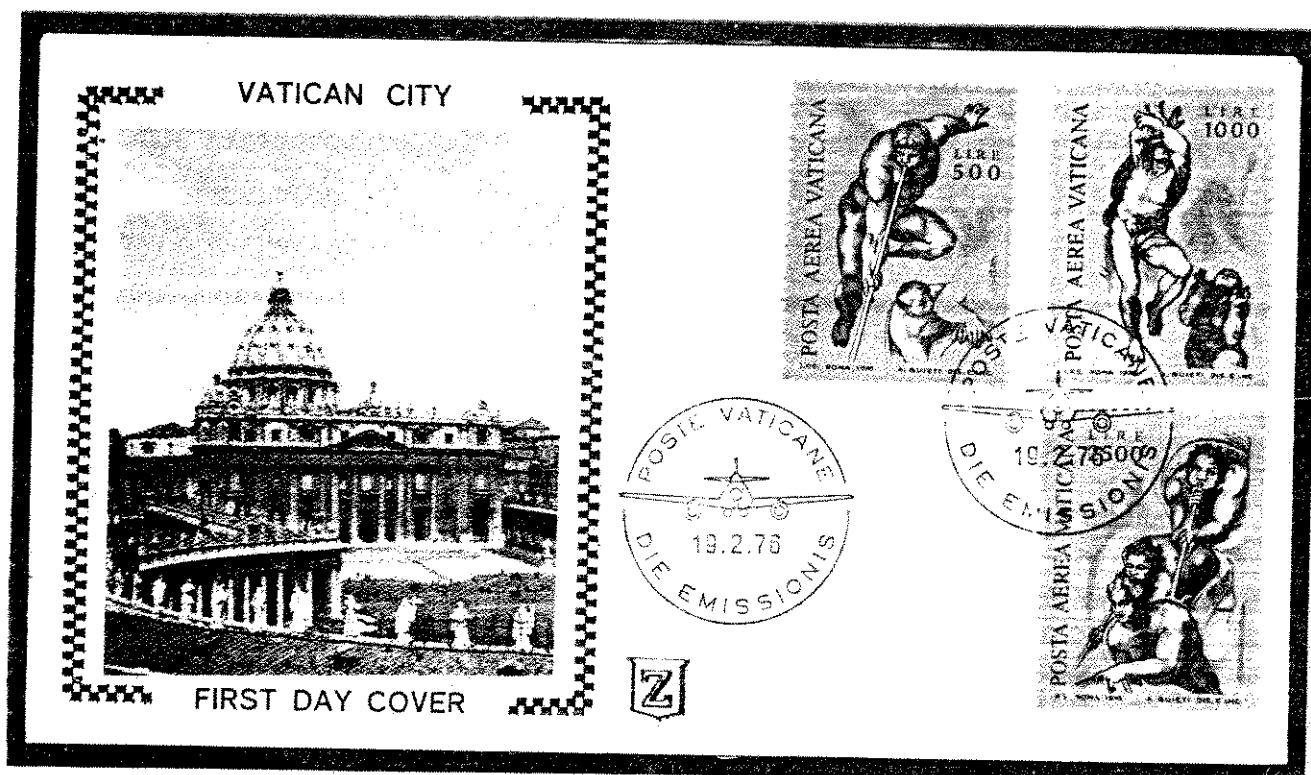

NEW AIRMAIL SERIES

A new series of airmail stamps was issued on February 19th. There are three stamps in the series, of three different values, 500, 1000 and 2500 lire, totalling 4000 lire. Depicted on each stamp is a different image of figures of angels and the Blessed taken from Michelangelo's fresco of the Last Judgment in the Sistine Chapel.

Alceo Quietì designed and engraved the stamps of this series. Printed in sheets of 20, they are vertical in form, and on the left side they carry, vertically, the inscription **POSTA AEREA VATICANA**. The values 500 and 100 are printed in the upper right, the value 2500 in the upper left.

Each measures 30 x 40 mm and has 13½ x 14 perforations. The printing was done by copper engraving and offset in two colors on white glossy paper, by the Polygraphic Institute of the Italian State. The complete printing amounts to 900,000 series.

ELECTION OF OFFICERS

The secret to the vitality, indeed to the very viability, of any organization is directly attributable to its LEADERSHIP. Nominations for Officers of the Vatican Philatelic Society for the next two years are now in order. ALL MEMBERS, PLEASE PAY HEED. Take note of the following excerpts from the BY-LAWS of the VPS.

ARTICLE 8 - NOMINATIONS AND BALLOTING

Section 1 - Nominations for all elective offices shall be prepared in duplicate and must be signed by a minimum of four (4) members in good standing who are not nominees. One copy of such nominations shall be submitted to the Secretary and a second to the Editor of the official Organ. In addition, each copy of nominations must be accompanied by a signed letter from all nominees, excepting incumbent officers, stating that if elected they will accept the office for which they are being nominated.

Section 2 - All nominations must be submitted by May 1st each even numbered year.

Section 3 - A ballot shall be prepared by the Editor of the Official Organ listing the names of the nominees which were received in the prescribed manner, without provision for write-in votes. Said ballot shall be mailed with the May-June issue of the Official Organ in each even numbered year and shall be returnable to the Secretary.

(EMPHASIS ADDED BY THE EDITOR)

We evidently have at least three fairly active Chapters, Chicagoland, Southern Wisconsin, and Eastern Massachusetts. If each of these Chapters could and would submit a proposed slate of candidates, The Society would benefit tremendously.

Individual members, too, can present candidates. It merely means taking a little time, making a little effort, to contact other members for necessary signatures.

VATICAN COINS

A series of coins for the thirteenth year of the Pontificate of His Holiness Pope Paul VI, bearing the date 1975, is being placed on sale March 22, 1976. The series is composed of eight coins at a cost of 6000 lire. Only one series per person is being allowed. Orders should be sent to the Numismatic Office of the Governatorato with the international postal order or bank draft made out to "Governatorato della Citta del Vaticano - Ufficio Numismatico" and must include the cost of registered postage (600 lire for Italy, 770 lire for all other countries. Insured mail adds 500 lire more (for Italy) and 250 lire more for others.

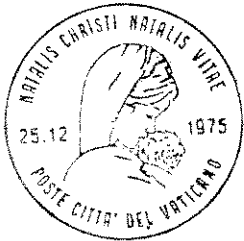

Frederick J. Levitsky



Double cancellation marking the closing of the Holy Year on December 24, 1975. The special inscription reads: "Pope Paul VI closes the Holy Door." This inscription appears on both the circular cancellation and the large pictorial cancellation. It is not known if these are two separate devices but the relative positions of both parts of the cancellation are the same on several covers at hand.



Cancellation marking Christmas, 1975. The cancellation reads: "Birth of Christ - Birth of Life."



Cancellation marking the Ninth World Day for Peace, January 1, 1976. The cancellation reads: "The Consensus of the People is the True Defense of Peace."

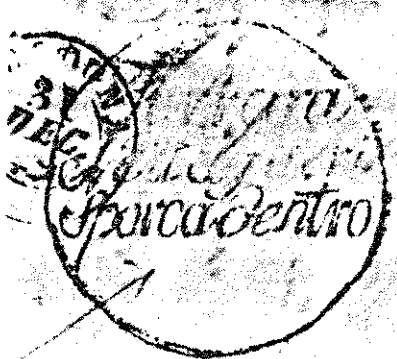

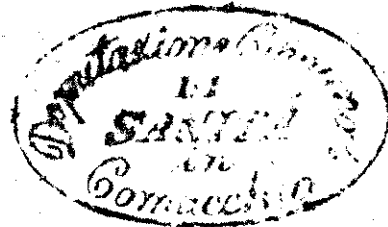
